Program for Teaching East Asia-National Consortium for Teaching about Asia 2011 Summer Institute on China for Secondary Teachers

The Program for Teaching East Asia (TEA) and the National Consortium for Teaching about Asia (NCTA) at the University of Colorado invite applications to a 2011 summer institute, **“21st-Century China: Global Issues, Classroom Applications.”**

The institute is open to secondary social studies teachers nationwide and is also designed as a national enrichment program for alumni of NCTA seminars. The residential program runs from July 17-22, 2011 on the University of Colorado-Boulder campus. The institute will focus on China’s role in the world through examination of key domestic and international issues and global relationships. The institute offers teachers a unique opportunity to consider these issues with specialists—including academics, policymakers, and journalists—who will share diverse perspectives on contemporary China. Among the questions that frame the 2011 institute are the following.

- What domestic policies fuel China’s growing global role?
- What responsibilities will China shoulder to protect global resources?
- What are the global repercussions of China’s economic reach into Asia and Africa?
- What are the present and future of the U.S.-China relationship?
- How and what should we teach to foster greater understanding of China?

Teachers will be selected for the program on a rolling-admission basis from January 20-March 4, 2011. All costs of the residential program are covered by a grant from the Freeman Foundation and teachers receive a travel and living expense stipend.
